



he votes have been counted, and it's finally time to make the results of *Jonesboro Occasions*' 2023 Readers' Choice Awards official.
















A CANVAS FOR THE COMMUNITY















hen Jonesboro's Rachel Anderson took a recent trip to Northwest Arkansas, she returned with an idea to help beautify the community by turning mundane utility cabinets into canvases for local artists.

Upon her return, Anderson, senior video analyst for the Jonesboro Police Department, said she began discussing the idea with other city officials.

"Immediately when I got back to Northeast Arkansas, I approached our traffic department (engineering department) about the possibility of even painting their cabinet boxes,"said Anderson. "They were on board, so I moved forward getting permission from the mayor's office."

Mayor Harold Copenhaver also gave his approval for the beautification project.

"Jonesboro has an abundance of young artists, and they have boundless creativity and know how to use a utility cabinet as a canvas. I've enjoyed seeing the different ideas and designs these artists have come up with," said Copenhaver.

In total, Anderson says there are 87 utility boxes in the city. "Thirty-three of the cabinets are on city property and can be painted on site," said Anderson. "Fifty-four of the cabinets must be wrapped – much like a vehicle – because they are on ARDOT (Arkansas Department of Transportation) property and they won't give us permission to paint on site ... because it is too dangerous to paint at those locations."

To date, several individual artists have painted cabinets, as well as students in three Jonesboro Public Schools EAST programs including Annie Camp Junior High School, Jonesboro High School and International Studies.

Designs are approved before painting begins, said Anderson.

"There is a committee made up of members of the public, the Jonesboro Police Department, the mayor's office, the engineering department and the parks department," she said.

Each artist/group gets \$100 credit at Ditta Ace Hardware for supplies and paint. Any expense exceeding that amount is paid by the artist.

Anderson said she is pleased with the curb appeal that the utility box art project is adding to the community.

"It's such a simple way to beautify the city," she said. "Everyone benefits from beautification projects."

Although she would like for the project to be completed as soon as possible, she estimates that it could take up to a year.

"I'd like for it to take a few months, but I'd be delighted if

we were done by this time next year," she said. "The wraps will take the longest by far because I'm going to have to get separate (private) funding donations for each one."

Response from the community has been positive.

"We have heard nothing but good things from the community and are looking forward to continuing the project and getting more boxes painted," said Anderson.

The city received "a ton of submissions," she said, so they are no longer accepting artist applications. Those who would like to help support the beautification project can still contribute, however. Sponsors are needed for the utility boxes that will need to be wrapped with an artist's design instead of painted. s more people today want to know exactly where their food comes from and what's in it, one couple is paving the way for their customers in Jonesboro to know exactly that. Randall and Amy Blankenship's Hydro House, a home-to-community farm that specializes in growing lettuce, herbs, microgreens and mushrooms, has a mission to serve the community with fresh, home-grown, local, pesticide-free produce year-round thanks to its hydroponic greenhouse.

"I've been here all my life," said Randall of the family home, which is also the site of Hydro House. "This is where my grandfather's cow pasture was. I've worked on farms and farmed for myself off and on my whole life. Amy is the one who has worked in greenhouses before; she came up with the greenhouse idea."

Amy has worked for several greenhouses over the years, including Rogers Greenhouse in Paragould, and loves nurturing plants of all types in a greenhouse environment. When the couple learned that the Rogers family was looking to get rid of a greenhouse structure they had over their pool, the Blankenships volunteered to remove it and repurpose it for Hydro House. Randall finished installing and redoing the greenhouse on their property in January of 2020.

Hydro House operates out of a hydroponic greenhouse, a technique of growing plants that uses a water-based nutrient solution rather than soil.

"Neither one of us knew anything about hydroponics when we started this," said Randall. "It's been a real learning curve. We use gutter downspouts to grow the lettuce and greens. The channels I looked at were \$80 each, and the downspouts were \$10 each, so that's what we used. I looked at several different ways to do it, watched a lot of YouTube videos and came up with my own plan. It's been off the cuff and a real learning process. ... The nutrients have to be checked constantly.

"We've learned a lot of ways not to do stuff. The hydroponic part of it is pretty amazing. To me, it tastes better. It's really amazing how fast stuff grows."

As for the day-to-day operations of the greenhouse, Amy takes care of the growing, planting and harvesting of everything in the greenhouse, and Randall is responsible for the mushrooms.

Hydro House grows a variety of leafy greens, including head lettuce offerings like muir, romaine, butterhead and Lalique, along with a mixed leaf lettuce. The small farm also has a greens mix that includes red and green mustard, broccoli, bok choi, Chinese cabbage, tatsoi and mizuna, along with arugula and kale, which are seasonal. There are a variety of microgreens to choose from, such as broccoli, cabbage, mustard, radish, beets, cilantro, sunflower, pea and more. Hydro House's available herbs are basil, rosemary, oregano, dill and mint.

The current mushroom selection, which is Randall's venture, includes the oyster varieties: Italian, tarragon, golden, pearls and



blues, Mediterranean, phoenix, lion's mane, shiitake and chestnut.

Customers can purchase all of Hydro House's mushrooms and greens on-site at the greenhouse or the Judd Hill Farmers' Market, or they can request a delivery through the couple's online store.

"We first started the online store in October 2021, but I found out I had breast cancer at the same time; I made my first delivery then had to close it," said Amy. "We were back at the Farmers' Market in May of 2022 and re-opened the store in November 2022 after the market ended in October. ...

"I love gardening. My mom and dad gardened; it's in my blood, it's therapy for me, it's my outlet. Being out here at night is really neat. With the water running, it's really peaceful."

Amy says that in the future, they'd like to offer ready-made salads, which would be available for pick up or delivery and would include seasonal vegetables such as cherry tomatoes, arugula and kale. She has already received her Food Service Manager Certification and Produce Safety Grower Certification, and Hydro House recently acquired its food trailer Health Department certification. A mushroom seasoning and other adventures are also in the works.

Jay Dunn, who has been a weekly customer of Hydro House since May of 2022, says she normally orders the house mix, salad mix, sandwich leaf, elegant greens and some of the microgreens.

"Two of my favorite highlights are that it's all pesticide free and local," said Dunn. "Their product selections are fresh, crisp and delicious. Their product is unbeatable, and their customer service is consistently amazing."

Another happy customer, Melody Conatser, sought out the

small farm's fresh offerings for a meaningful reason.

"We have been using Hydro House since last summer, when we met the Blankenships at the Judd Hill Farmers' Market," she said. "Being a registered nurse and also a cancer survivor, I realize the importance of feeding my family pesticide-free produce.

"We use the various salad greens, herbs, microgreens and mushrooms from them, knowing that it's all fresh, nutritious and delicious. Their home delivery service has been an added bonus during the winter months or when we are unable to get to the Farmers' Market during the regular season. It's been such a pleasure getting to know the Blankenships."

The couple cites those friendships and customer relationships as a large part of why they enjoy what they contribute to the community.

"We stand behind our products," said Amy. "Our customers know that they are getting a fresh, quality product, and they keep coming back. They tell their family and friends. Word of mouth is our best advertisement. I have had (customers) tell me they can't eat lettuce from anywhere else now that they had ours.

"We are so proud of what we do. I enjoy being a problem solver with the community and being able to offer what we do. I want to know where my food is coming from these days, and we can do that for Jonesboro and the surrounding area. I enjoy working with the community and meeting new people. We have made a lot of close friends during this."

The Return of Presley's Drive In

s Jonesboro's West End Neighborhood and the Gee Street area continue to attract businesses and patrons, the recent return and re-opening of an iconic Jonesboro restaurant, Presley's Drive In, has been welcomed with open arms by those who frequented the eatery for the past several decades and by those who are new to supporting the growing area.

Presley's Drive In was started in the 1970s by Harold and Hettie Mae Presley and was passed along to several other owners before closing over a year ago. The restaurant's newest owners, LaDonya Bryant and Dusty Self, hope to continue to serve the community with the same all-American feel and classic diner food patrons are used to, while at the same time adding a few of Bryant's own recipes that she grew up cooking.

"I used to cook with my mom and grandmother and then started cooking at church for the youth group, which was 150 kids," said Bryant, who grew up in Powhatan and graduated from Black Rock High School before moving to Jonesboro in 2016 to work for the United States Postal Service. "I thought, 'If I could do this, I could do a restaurant.' It was far-fetched, but it's what I wanted to do."

Bryant soon learned that Jeb Spencer and his son, Jackson, along with Jackson's wife, Lindsey, were nearing the end of their year-long renovation of Presley's Drive In, a longtime restaurant space on Gee Street. After the former owners closed the restaurant, the Spencers bought the building in May of 2022 and completely renovated the diner while keeping much of its historic character intact.

"It's a legacy place; it's been around forever, and we wanted to bring something like that back to that side of town," said Jackson. "It's a classic American diner, the kind of place that's critical to have for that side of town. Because of the condition it was in when we bought it, it needed love and attention."

The Spencers replaced all of the glass, installed new floors and light fixtures, painted the interior and exterior and did electrical work.

"We brought back the walkup window, which is a traditional dairy bar aspect," said Jackson, who is one of the owners of Native Brew Works, also located on Gee Street. "We wanted to go back to the traditional style – red with some black and white – and we did certain things to maintain that diner feel. We also took out a parking area and turned it into green space. We wanted to beautify



Gee Street; the area has so much asphalt and concrete, we wanted a view of the creek and a lawn."

"Presley's is one of the most iconic buildings in Jonesboro," added Lindsey. "Of course, we are invested in Gee Street and we wanted to see it brought back to its original glory. It's a great representation of Gee Street in its heyday with its style and vibe. .. I would love to see it lit up and attracting more people again."

Bryant and her boyfriend, Dusty Self, leased the building from the Spencers and launched with a soft opening earlier this spring with plans for a grand opening sometime this month.

"The people in the Gee Street area have been so nice," said Bryant. "The customer base here is wonderful. We have really good neighbors, and they eat with us. More people need to give this area a chance; it's come such a long way."

Presley's breakfast menu starts bright and early and includes the Classic, which is two eggs, a choice of meat and biscuits and gravy or toast; the Breakfast Special, which comes with one egg, half an order of meat with toast and jelly; Hound Dog Hash, which is served with two eggs, a choice of breakfast meat, bell peppers, onions, tomatoes, cheese, shredded home fries and jalapenos; biscuits and gravy and two different omelets.

The lunch menu focuses on classic Southern diner food, as well. The hamburger steak, chicken fried steak, chicken strip dinner and single and double cheeseburger options are staples, and side options include mashed potatoes, green beans, cabbage with

sausage, corn, greens, mac and cheese, and white and brown gravy.

"A lot of the stuff I brought with me has been really popular," said the new owner. "My beef enchiladas have been a hit; it's my granny's recipe. Our customers have really loved the chicken and dressing, too. We do offer a fajita chicken salad, and that sells big time, and so does the Chicken Bacon Ranch Sandwich and the Philly, which they had before."

Many of those family recipes have made their way onto the plate lunch schedule, which is offered Monday through Saturday. Each day, diners can choose one meat, two sides, a roll and a drink. Meat options vary each day and include meatloaf, chicken fried steak, chicken and dressing, Mexican chicken, beef enchiladas, hamburger steak, pork steaks and U.S. Farm-Raised Catfish with slaw and hush puppies.

As the restaurant prepares for its grand opening, Bryant and Self have been open to suggestions and requests from the restaurant's former patrons, including the return of the Pizza Burger, a longtime favorite, and the Totally Loaded Fries, which are crinkle-cut fries with fajita chicken, ground beef, chili, bacon, onions, tomatoes and cheese sauce. Fish and frog legs are always on hand, too.

Presley's deserts have always been a favorite, and Bryant and Self want their cakes, pies, hand-dipped cones, shakes and soft serve ice cream to become a community staple once again.

"All those desserts will be coming back in July," said Bryant. "June was about getting everyone here and back in the swing of things.

"During the holidays we have a lot of catering; we can cook





a whole holiday meal. Our pies are really popular; we make chocolate, pecan, lemon and coconut cream pies. And the chicken and dumplings sell out every time I make them. ... I have no professional training, I'm just a person who likes to cook."

The menu itself is still a work in progress prior to the grand opening, partially because customers who have been frequenting the diner since the '70s want to make sure they can still order all their favorites.

"The longtime Presley's customers are very opinionated and let me know their requests," said Bryant. "They ask for certain things to be brought back to the menu, and we do our best to accommodate what they want.

"But my favorite part is the stories they tell us. I love listening to the stories; people come in and the old stories they have about Elvis Presley here at the diner are amazing. So many people in this community have something to add."

Bryant says a gentleman who recently stopped by Presley's to eat recounted a story where Elvis and Jerry Lee Lewis came by Presley's Drive In and were playing in the parking lot one evening. When Jonesboro Police Department officers came by and asked them to stop playing, they refused and kept playing for hours. Many patrons have told the new owners that Elvis would come in and regularly sit in the same corner booth.

Terry Presley, son of Harold and Hettie Presley, says his parents purchased the business in 1973.

"At that time, it was a Tasty Freeze, and before that, originally, it was a Dairy Queen," said Terry. "After about six months, my mother



decided to drop the franchise and start Presley's Drive-In. My mother was the driving force that made this adventure a success. My wife, Kelly, and I purchased the business from her in the late 1980s and we ran it until August 2000. I had a debilitating heart attack in May of that year and that's when we decided to sell."

As for the family's relation to Elvis Presley, Terry confirmed the family's connection to the music icon.

"My grandparents, Jesse Caswell and Lovie Mae Presley, moved from Mississippi in the 1940s. They crossed the river and settled in the Payneway/McCormick area just outside of Trumann. My cousin, Donald Presley, wrote a genealogy book called 'From the Rhineland to Graceland' that documents our family's kinship and the original German surname of Preslar."

To honor the distant relative of the original owners and the history of the diner, Bryant plans to have a relative of Elvis at the grand opening.

As Presley's Drive In finds its place among a revitalized Gee Street, its new owners hope it will again become a staple for families and regulars in the area.

"It's a family atmosphere," said Bryant. "The people who come in here remember eating with each other before. We have people come in and pull tables together. It's very relaxed and family oriented. They love the remodel and have just been so positive."

Presley's Drive-In, located at 917 S. Gee St., is open Monday through Friday from 6:30 a.m. to 2 p.m. and Saturday from 7 a.m. to 2 p.m. For more information about weekly specials and special events, find Presley's Drive In LLC on Facebook or call (870) 206-8282.

"You can't talk about American music history without talking about Johnny Cash. He was a trailblazer in his music and his activism, and it's important to continue honoring his legacy because he paved the way for so many who followed in his musical footsteps," added Jarosz.

This is the first event in this series. In addition to the music, the performance will encompass the importance and meaning behind the stories of songs.

"I think it will be a poignant evening of music and the community is lucky to have such a unique event. I'm personally looking forward to hearing Rosanne's and Rodney's stories and sharing songs with them," said Jarosz.

n a recent trip to visit my daughter, she threw together an impromptu party to introduce me to some of her new friends. We had a "good wine, cheap snacks" party, and it was so much fun. It prompted me to remind myself that entertaining doesn't have to be ultra labor-intensive or expensive.

As I've said before, I don't entertain nearly as much as I did when I was younger; these days, when I have people in it's primarily family. No matter what, it can be fun and inexpensive if you use what you have and get creative with menu and decor. Here are a few ideas:

Think charcuterie for your big item. Even though charcuterie typically contains meats, you can also do fruit, nuts or candies. A mixture of offerings can be interesting and fun.


If you use candles, consider all sizes and types of candle holders. You can place them in the center of the table or interspersed among the food offerings.

UNDERSTANDING ULTRA-PROCESSED FOODS

he industrialization of food production in order to feed a growing population has led to cheap, mass-produced food-like substances that are nutritionally questionable. These ultra-processed foods, or UPFs, fill our grocery stores to the point that the average American now gets roughly 60% of his or her calories from foods like bars, cereals, frozen convenience foods, fast foods and snack foods. Ultra-processed foods have totally altered the way we eat, and not for the better.

There are many health concerns that arise from eating too much of these types of foods, such as high blood pressure, diabetes, obesity, cancers and heart disease. Recent research has led scientists to believe that consuming a diet filled with UPFs is associated with higher rates of anxiety, depression and even cognitive decline. Knowing more about UPFs can help you make better choices for you and your family's nutritional needs.

Brazilian researchers developed a food classification system called NOVA that is now widely used by scientists who study food, nutrition and health. NOVA assigns food into four categories from unprocessed to ultra-processed. Group one is unprocessed or minimally processed foods - fresh fruits and vegetables, meats, eggs, milk. Group two is processed culinary ingredients like sugars, oils and butter. Group three is processed foods like canned vegetables, breads, cheeses and cereals. Group four is the ultrahigh processed foods that usually are high in salt, sugar and fats while being low in fiber, minerals, vitamins and protein, such as packaged baked goods, sodas and crackers.

NOVA defines UPFs as foods that are made by extracting substances from whole foods and altering them with chemicals or additives to produce the final product. A hallmark of ultraprocessed foods is that they contain ingredients rarely used at home, those unpronounceable long chemical sounding words that make you think of industrial uses, not food – high fructose corn syrup, hydrogenated oils, disodium insinuate, disodium guanylate, xanthum gum, etc. The more processed a food is, the less it resembles real food and the longer its shelf life.


Before eating, almost all foods are processed to some degree, except for raw fruits and vegetables. Cooking is a process and usually involves adding ingredients like oils, salts and other seasonings. But ultra-processed foods have been engineered to be very palatable, even addictive. Food scientists know that our bodies evolved to survive famine by developing an affinity for carbs and fatty foods. They have designed UPFs to contain easily digested carbs and simple sugars paired with salt and fat, the sweet spot for our tastebuds and the reward center in our brain.

When we feel happiness or joy, it's because of the release of dopamine and serotonin which are the so-called feel-good chemicals in our brain. Various things trigger the release of these chemicals, such as exercise, seeing a newborn or playing with a pet. Alcohol and drugs can also cause these good feelings, as can highly processed foods. Whole foods cooked so that they are still recognizable contain nutrients such as fiber that slows our digestion and how quickly our bodies absorb those nutrients. On the other hand, ultra-processed foods lack such additional nutrients and are full of quickly digested and absorbed carbohydrates and added fats. This gives our brain a hit of dopamine and leaves us craving more.

Why should we worry? Scientific evidence has long linked eating these processed foods like hot dogs, chips and packaged sweets with various health problems. Now there may be more cause for concern. Two studies in 2022 found that the more UPFs a person ate, the more likely they were to suffer from feelings of anxiety or depression. Another study followed 11,000 adults over a decade and found that the more UPFs a participant consumed, the more they experienced a decrease in cognitive function (the ability to learn, remember, reason and solve problems) by as much as 28%. Other studies have found that eating a healthy diet overall while eating UPFs occasionally seemed to offset any negative impacts from UPFs, but researchers don't know what amount of UPFs can be considered safe to consume.

While more studies are needed to find definitive answers, researchers believe UPFs negatively affect gut health. Our gut needs plenty of fiber to function properly, and diets high in UPFs are notoriously low in fiber and other nutrients important for gut health. Fiber is also necessary to produce short chain fatty acids, which are substances produced when your gut bacteria ferments fiber that you have eaten. These short chain fatty acids are important for brain health and protect against diseases like

It's easy to see that the only good things about UPFs are their taste and convenience, but that convenience comes with a pretty steep price in terms of your health. Children raised on a steady diet of junk can expect to have health problems at an early age and perhaps a shortened life span. Don't let package wording like "organic," "made with whole grains" or advertisements for plant-based food fool you into believing a processed food is healthy; even organic, plant-based foods have become UPFs like some oat milks and snacks marketed for babies and toddlers. Read the nutrition label. Better yet, focus your diet on whole, fresh fruits and vegetables, whole grains and meats that you prepare at home.

IT WAS EARLY SPRING WHEN I NOTICED THE FIRST BLUEBIRD IN OUR BACKYARD. He was sitting on top of a

blue birdhouse designed to look like a church that I bought last year.

We live just inside the bypass, not far from the thousands of vehicles that travel the interstate every day, so I was both surprised and delighted to see him perched on top of the small blue church.

A few days later, the female landed on top of another birdhouse that my son, Adam, had given me as a Mother's Day gift. During the next few days, we realized she was building a nest in the blue church. I think that was the moment when I officially turned into a bird nerd.

We restocked our Japanese Maple with suet that was suitable for bluebirds and watched from the deck as the male and female fed throughout the day. As the female gathered twigs for her nest, the male would fly down and sit on top of the church as soon as she disappeared inside. Once she exited the birdhouse, the male would fly back to a nearby tree until it was time to stand guard again.

We gave them their space and tried not to disturb them while they were preparing for their brood, but I would be lying if I said we did not attempt to peep inside the birdhouse once or twice to see if there were eggs or babies. After nearly a month had passed, we stopped seeing the adult bluebirds going into the blue church. We were a little concerned that something had happened to them and missed seeing them play in the backyard.

A few weeks later, I noticed the adult male had returned to the Japanese Maple and the female soon followed with her young brood. To our surprise, there were now six bluebirds making their home in our backyard – two adults and four babies. That's a whole lot of happiness. I felt like we had won the bluebird lottery as we watched all six land in the tree or on a nearby power line.

With four more mouths to feed, we restocked the tree with suet and bought an additional birdfeeder that we filled with mealworms – a bluebird favorite. We watched as the bluebirds, cardinals and occasional pesky blue jay fed from the tree.

To my surprise, I soon began seeing the male and female working on another nest in the blue church. They barely had their first four out of the house and they were already preparing for their next brood. After a little research, I learned that bluebirds are monogamous and sometimes have up to three broods between March and August.

I may never have enough patience to go out in the wilderness birdwatching for certain species, but even I am a little shocked at how easy it was to become obsessed with our new feathered friends. With the help of a bird app on my phone, I am discovering the identities, calls and songs of the birds in our backyard. I've also ordered a pair of binoculars for better birdwatching and can't wait to get a few close-up photos of our backyard broods. Seriously, who have I become?

The sighting of a bluebird has brought joy to people for thousands of years, and many cultures view it as a symbol of joy, happiness and luck. It's been a challenging year so far, and we could use all three. Perhaps that's why they landed at our home.

Whatever the reason, it's a bluebird kind of summer at our house, and we are looking forward to watching another brood of happiness take flight in our own backyard, even if we have to help launch them ourselves.
